COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course covers basic elements of microeconomic and macroeconomic reasoning at an introductory level. Topics include Individual Constraints and Preferences, Production by Firms, Market Transactions, Competition, The Distribution of Income, Technological Progress and Growth, Unemployment and Inflation, the Role of Government in the Economy.

PREREQUISITES

No prerequisites required for this course.

REQUIRED TEXTBOOK

The text required for this course is the *Principles of Economics* 7th edition by Gregory Mankiw, Harvard University. This is an excellent textbook and should be available online through Sakai (see the instructions below) or at the Barnes & Nobel bookstore, where you can ask for the ISBN 9781305102422 LMS Integrated for MindTap® Economics, 1 term (6 months) Printed Access Card for Mankiw's Principles of Economics, 7th.
